## Making a Works Cited Page

A Works Cited Page comes on a separate page, the end of your paper.

It needs to include all of the sources you used in the body of your paper as in-text citations. However, if you didn't use or cite a document, it does not need to be used in your Works Cited.

Entries in a works cited page are in alphabetical order, beginning with the first letter on the far left of the entry.

Every line is double spaced.

The second and third lines are indented. This is called a hanging indent.

A simple way to make a Works Cited page for your argumentative essay on the atomic bomb is to:

- 1. Open a new google document.
- 2. Make the title Works Cited and center title.
- 3. Go to the atomic bomb sources found on our website: http://daveforrest.net/world/atomicbombsources.pdf
- 4. Copy the source information for each source you used in the body of your paper and paste each source citation into your Works Cited document.
- 5. Put the source list in alphabetical order.
- 6. Double space the document.
- 7. Put in the proper hanging indents, for the second and third lines of a source.
