Organizing an Argumentative Essay

Your essay is most easily organized into five paragraphs. Open your essay with an introductory paragraph. Each of the three body paragraphs should be directly connected to the reasons in your claim, found in your introduction. For example, my claim was:

Although some people prefer cats, dogs make better pets because they are more loyal than cats, they provide protection, and they encourage their owners to exercise.

Therefore the topic sentences of my body paragraphs might be the following
Body 1 Topic Sentence: Dogs are more loyal than cats.
Body 2 Topic Sentence: Dogs bark loudly and are good at protecting an owner's home.
Body 3 Topic Sentence: Dogs need to be walked, which encourages their owners to exercise.
