

Your Turn To Teach

You've listened and learned from me this year. Now it's your turn to teach.

Skim your textbook chapters 16-19. Pick one section to learn about. Sign up for one of the chapter sections within the chapters. Sign up for the chapter and section for your project.

1. **Research and Reading:** Take in depth Cornell Notes on your section. Find more information on your topic by using Gale Group for research.
2. **Slideshow:** Pick one of the experiences in your section. Be sure to get my approval first. Then design a slideshow of eight cards. Be sure each card has both visuals and text. Submit your slideshow to turnitin and then fix any errors.
3. **Teaching Option:** think of a way to share your information with your classmates. For example, you may design an infographic, poster, or piece of art. You may decide on an oral presentation, rap, or skit. How about interviewing a relative who immigrated from your country and telling their story. Or you can simply design a classroom activity, to help students understand your topic.
4. **Presentation:** Make a presentation to the class.

You may work alone or with a partner. The grading for the project will be worth 100 points, broken down in the following fashion:

25 Points - Research and Cornell Notes

25 Points - SlideShow

25 Points - Teaching Option

25 Points - Presentation
